celebrate mother *card*

This pretty card is a great introduction to background stamps and their versatility. Also, learn to create two-tone ink effects with a simple "Rock & Roll" technique taught by Stampin' Up!®.

you'll need

Papers

- Card stock (Stampin' Up!®): Apricot Appeal; Whisper White.

Embellishments

- White/iridescent glitter.
- Apricot Appeal grosgrain ribbon (Stampin' Up!®).

Tools & Supplies

- Stamp sets (Stampin' Up!®): Floral Background; Label Classics; Letterpress Alphabet; Everyday Flexible Phrases.
- Classic Stampin' Pads dye ink: Apricot Appeal; Pumpkin Pie.
- Craft punches (Stampin' Up!®): Slot; Word Window.
- Post-it® notes.
- Coluzzle® Oval Starter Kit: template; swivel knife; cutting mat (ProvoCraft®).
- Dimensional adhesive dots.

what to do

- 1 Cut apricot card stock to 4¼" x 11"; score and fold in half.
- 2 Cut 4" x 5¼" white card stock piece and stamp with apricot large floral background. Adhere to card.
- 3 Stamp orange sentiment on apricot card stock; punch out with word window punch and adhere to card.
- 4 Cut medium-sized oval from apricot card stock using template. Punch each end with slot punch and thread ribbon through holes. Spot glue oval to card. Tie ribbon around card front; trim ends.
- 5 Stamp apricot label image on white card stock and again on sticky note to create mask; no need to re-ink stamp between impressions. Be sure to stamp at least part of the mask image over adhesive-backed portion of note. Use

template to cut smaller oval from center of image on sticky note. 6 Align mask over card stock label and stamp apricot large floral background. Remove mask; cut out label. 7 *Rock & Roll Technique*: Ink letter "M" stamp with apricot ink, then press edges of inked stamp in a rolling motion onto orange ink pad, being careful not to ink center of the stamp. 8 Breathe across stamp to re-moisten ink and stamp onto white card stock; sprinkle with glitter. Cut out letter and adhere to label. Adhere label to card with adhesive dots.
