

scrap tree ornament

Use up scraps from a single paper manufacturer to create a cute, coordinated holiday icon, or raid your stash for a variety of patterns and colors.

you'll need

Paper & Embellishments

- Kraft card stock*.
- Assorted paper scraps*.
- Green Circle Calendar Journaling Sprout*.
- Red/Cream Mini Market stickers (October Afternoon).
- Brenda Walton Collection green adhesive gems (K&Co.).
- Green twine*.

Tools & Supplies

- Prismacolor® Lime colored pencil (Newell Rubbermaid).
- Scor-Tape® (Scor-Pal®).

project size: 4"x6"

what to do

- 1 Hand-cut tree shape from 4"x5" piece of kraft card stock. Adhere brown paper to trunk. Cover tree "body" with strips of Scor-Tape®.
- 2 Cut paper scraps into thin, 1"-long strips. Bring ends of each strip together and press to tree, alternating patterns and colors as desired. Begin along bottom of tree and work up, so each new layer overlaps layer below. Apply additional tape strips along top edge of each finished layer so new layer will stick well. Trim paper flush with edges of tree.
- 3 Cut 5" twine length and knot ends; glue knot to top of tree for hanger. Tie twine around tree trunk.
- 4 Color scalloped edges of journaling circle with lime pencil. Add number stickers and gems. Adhere circle to top of tree over hanger ends.
